PLEASE NOTE RULING REGARDING PRELIMINARY CHAMPIONSHIPS IN MID-ATLANTIC REGION:

Open to competitors who have placed 1st in Prizewinner solo light (Reel or Slip Jig) and heavy dance (Jig or Hornpipe) at any Feis. Dancers who win THREE 1st places Preliminary Championships in one calendar year must move onto Open the following calendar year. When a third 1ST place win is achieved over several calendar years, the dancer must move to Open Championship the following weekend.

CHOICE of REEL (48 BARS) OR SLIP JIG (40 BARS) AND JIG (48 BARS) OR HORNPIPE (40 BARS).

- 1. The Championships shall be known as:
 - a. The North American Feis Commission Senior Irish Dance Championship for the Gerry Campbell Perpetual Belt.
 - b. The North American Feis Commission Junior Irish Dance Championship for the Robert Gabor Perpetual Belt.
 - c. The North American Feis Commission Minor Irish Dance Championship for the George Sweetnam Perpetual Belt.
- 2. Competitor's age will be calculated as of January 1st.
- 3. Perpetual Awards are the sole property of the NAFC. The winner must transfer the Championship award to the next year's Championship committee, one month prior to the date of the Championships. Replacement award will be given at the time of the win. There is also a \$500 scholarship award for each winner.
- 4. Five adjudicators are required for the NAFC Championships. Every attempt will be made to select a fair representation of adjudicators from across the Region.
- 5. QUALIFYING AGE GROUPS:
 - a. SENIOR BELT- 17 AND OVER
 - b. JUNIOR BELT- UNDER 14 TO UNDER 17
 - c. MINOR BELT- UNDER 13 & YOUNGER
- 6. Competitors who qualify for each Championship category must have placed **FIRST** in that category in any CLRG regionally sanctioned feis in **2021** or **2022** prior to the date the Championship is held. Championship competitors must provide their qualifying Feis and date in order to finalize their entry into this event.
- 7. Competitors must dance a total of 3 dances: a choice of soft shoe, a choice of hard shoe and a set dance. These must be listed at the time of entry. The committee reserves the right to have a recall.
- 8. Both males and females compete together in the NAFC Championship.
- 9. The top 6 will be recognized.
- 10. Any interference by teachers or the audience on behalf of a competitor or competitors will mean immediate disqualification of the competitor or competitors.
- 11. Competitors must report to the assigned stage, ready to compete when the Championship is announced. Under no circumstances will the Championship be delayed because a competitor is not present or refuses to dance when a Stage Manager calls his or her number. Any infraction of this rule will mean immediate disqualification of the competitor.
- 12. Only first place will be revealed and no marks will be distributed.
- 13. All three Championship will go to tabulation.
- 14. Special competitions may be held which are open to all Championship dancers.

Ensembles

The open ensemble competitions are open to any musician of the appropriate age group. Competitors in the **under 10** and **10-13** age groups will play one (1) tune from each of **two** (2) music classes. Competitors in the **14-18** age groups will play one (1) tune from each of **three** (3) music classes. Competitors may compete in a higher age group, as long as one of the members of the ensemble is of the appropriate age for the group.

- 1. Only Irish traditional music and traditional Irish songs will be accepted in all competitions.
- 2. In Singing Competitions, when singing more than one song should be slow and the other song should be a different tempo.
- 3. All keyboards must supply their own energy source (batteries)
- 4. A satisfactory standard is necessary for awarding first or any other prize.
- 5. The Feis secretary may require proof of age.
- 6. Competitors who do not present themselves when their competition is called may be disqualified. Every effort will be made to accommodate time conflicts for competitors also involved in a dance Competition.
- 7. Competitors in duets and trio competitions must play the melody of the tune.
- 8. Miscellaneous Instruments are instruments that are not listed as specific Instruments
- 9. Groups are considered with more than 5 musicians
- 10. Fee -\$10.00 per Competition

DANCING COMPETITION RULES

Rules Governing IDTANA Mid-Atlantic Region, Inc., Feiseanna

- 1) In the case of all solo and team competitions in all grades, the age of a competitor on the 1st of January of the year in which the competition is held will determine the right of the entry. For the purposes of this rule, a competitor whose birthday occurs on the 1st of January shall be deemed to be under the age attained on that date.
- 2) Competitions are open to all but those holding a TMRF, TCRG, or ADCRG designation. A Feis can only accept entries from pupils of teachers registered with An Coimisuin, regardless of their domicile, and where applicable, registered with both the IDTANA and the North American Region in which they reside.
- 3) A competitor may be disqualified for any of the following reasons:
 - 1. Conduct unbecoming a lady or gentleman
 - 2. Failure to report on time to compete (Penalty: Disqualification from said event)
 - 3. Falsification of age or other important facts i.e. Teaching, award winning, competing under another competitors name or number, etc.
 - 4. Penalty for a or c: Competitor will be disqualified from the Feis at which the occurrence happened and from all MAR registered Feiseanna for a period of one year beginning at the date of the occurrence.
- 4) Competitions may be closed if there are no competitors at the assigned stage ready to compete when the competition is scheduled or announced. This may not pertain to a situation where competitors are involved in stage conflicts.
- 5) Solo competitors in Beginner, Advanced Beginner, Novice, or Prizewinner competitions:
 - 1. Must compete in their own age group
 - 2. Must be prepared to perform two (2) steps in each event
- 6) Steel taps or "bubble" heels on dancing shoes, display of awards, wearing of shorts or other unconventional dress is prohibited. Authentic Gaelic dress is desired. First Feis (if offered), Beginner and Advanced Beginner, must wear a class costume, a skirt and blouse, shirt and trousers, or a kilt. Modest attire is encouraged when a competitor is not dancing. Adjudicators who determine a costume to be too short or to lack modesty may ask a competitor to change into black tights (of a denier not less than 70%) in order for the dancer to continue in the competition. When wearing body suits with skirts (commonly known as blackout attire), dancers Under 14 and older must wear black tights (of a denier not less than 70%).
- 7) A competitor's number must be worn and visible to adjudicators when performing in all competitions; use of reflective plastic number covers is discouraged.
- 8) Awards will be determined in proportion to the number of entries in each competition and t the degree of proficiency shown.
- 9) Complaints regarding of the running or rules of a Feis must be in writing, stating names and other factual information and signed by the complainant. A \$50 fee must be enclosed and presented to the Feis Chairperson within one hour of the occurrence. The fee will be returned if the complaint is upheld.

- 10) The Feis Committee and any organization affiliated with same, will not be held responsible for personal injury, property loss or damage. Destruction of Feis property or rental property will be punishable by law.
- 11) The Feis reserves the right to reject any entry for cause, to cancel all or part of the Feis and to limit competitors performing time. The decision of the Feis Committee is final in all matters connected with the Feis.
- 12) All Feiseanna must have a process to allow parents to request that their child or children's name(s) not be listed on the posted competitor list prior to the day of the Feis.
- 13) Competitors must answer all questions as required by the Feis Entry Committee, including teacher's name, and enclose the entry fee when registering. Failure to do so will result in a rejected entry. Entries must be received on or before the closing date or they will be subject to a late fee determined by the feis.
- 14) Entrants in any Championship event may not enter in any other (Grade) events, but may enter in Figure Dances and or Ceili Dance. Entrants in Championships should specify on the entry form their choice of set dance. Entrants cannot change competition or category on the day of the competition.
 - Dancers must qualify for Open Championships via the method now in place for Preliminary Championships, i.e. Three 1st place wins.
 - 2. Dancers must compete in the Preliminary Championships in order to qualify for Open Championships.
 - 3. The Regional syllabus where the Feis is being held may have different qualifications for entry but MAR dancers must follow MAR rules when dancing out of Region.
- 15) Open and Preliminary Championships require at least three (3) adjudicators.
- 16) First Place winners in the Open Championship category cannot return to a Preliminary or Prizewinner competition. Placing in a Regional or National Oireachtas DOES NOT change the status of a competitor. A dancer who moves into Open Championships MUST stay a minimum of two (2) years. If after two (2) years they have not placed they are allowed to return to Preliminary Championship. An Open Championship dancer who places is not allowed to return to Preliminary Championship until two (2) years after their last placement.
- 17) The status of the dancer does not change unless there are five (5) or more dancers in a competition.
- 18) The syllabus is to contain all Grade categories. A Feis Committee may combine two (2) consecutive age categories into the higher of the two (2) categories within that Grade when less than five (5) competitors are entered.
- 19) Musicians and Adjudicators CANNOT be approached during a competition by anyone except the Feis Committee. No one can approach them while a competitor is performing.
- 20) Musicians employed by the Feis Committee will be solely under the direction and management of the Feis Committee on Feis day.
- 21) In matters pertaining to adjudication, the decision of the adjudicators is final.
- 22) Adjudicators are to monitor the tempo of music at the stage(s) to which they are assigned.
- 23) The Length of 2 Hand and 3 Hand dances in competition are to be 48 bars of music plus an 8-bar introduction.

- 24) In consideration of safety and in fairness to dancers performing at a Feis, photography of any kind which has the capability of capturing a dancer's image while in motion is strictly forbidden except for in the Beginner and Advanced Beginner category. A Feis may elect to allow in motion photography for publicity purposes, but the pictures are considered the sole property of the Feis and solely for Feis use only; these are not to be used for personal gain through commercial use of sale, and under no circumstances can they be published on any website or other area without the express written permission of the persons involved. Additionally, a professional photographer may be formally contracted by a Feis to capture non-motion photographs, such as portrait photography, award ceremonies, etc. and/or in-motion photography provided it is taken at a vendor station or suitable location: a) away from the dancing stages and b) requested by a consenting parent, guardian, or dancer (over the age of 18).
- 25) No block, en pointe, toe walking movements, stationary or moving, is allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the Under 12 age group. However, after September 1st of each year an exception is made for those dancers who are eleven dancing in the Under 12 age group.
- 26) Makeup is prohibited on a dancer up to and including the Under 10 age group.
- 27) Any competitor found to be using artificial carriage aides and who subsequently refuses to remove same will be subject to disqualification from that particular competition. Medically prescribed aides (proof of which may be required) will be exempt from this rule.
- 28) Each Feis is required to list their Adjudicators on their syllabus and/or website. If Adjudicators are not listed on the syllabus, they must be posted on the Feis website a minimum of three (3) weeks prior to the Feis date. Once the Feis has closed for entries the Adjudicators names may be removed from the Feis website. One third of the Adjudicators are to be from outside the Region where the Feis is being held.
- 29) No substance that can become airborne should be used on any dance floor in an attempt to improve traction.
- 30) Championship stage sizes should be at least 24' wide by 20' deep. Solo and Figure dancing stage should be at least 20' wide by 16' deep. Choreography stages should be at least 24' wide by 20' deep.
- 31) Championship stage dancing 3 dancers at a time must be at least 32' wide by 24' deep. This is limited to those dancing Under 14.
- 32) Non-championship stage dancing 3 dancers at a time must be at least 24' wide by 20' deep for each age group as prescribed by CLRG. The Adjudicator has the authority to dance the dancers 2 or 3 at a time unless specified in the syllabus.
- 33) The MAR Feis Committee must receive in writing any notification of a violation occurring at a MAR approved Feis, identifying the name and contact information of the person submitting the violation. A violation is defined as any instance where a Feis rule was not adhered to, ie. Stage size requirements. A substantiated violation will be presented to MAR Executive Board for their review. The Feis organizer will be given ten (10) days to respond. Any determination resulting in a valid violation will result in written notification to the Feis organizer advising remedy of the violation must occur by or before their next Feis. A representative of the MAR Feis Committee and/or Executive Board must attend the Feis to verify compliance. If the violation is still present the following action will be taken:
 - 1. Formal notification (certified mail/return receipt) given to the Feis organizer that their Feis will be suspended the following year.
 - 2. Notification regarding the suspension will also be sent to the IDTANA President.

- 5. In order to be reinstated, a written plan to remedy the violation must be submitted to the IVIAK Feis Committee and/or the MAR Executive Board.
- 4. Further violations, or non-compliance could result in further action left to the discretion of the MAR Executive Board.
